When attracting butterflies into the garden, be sure to not only provide flowers (nectar) for mature butterflies but also provide plants to host young butterfly larva.

When attracting song birds and hummingbirds into the garden, be sure to keep your feeders clean! If squirrels are a nuisance try adding cayenne pepper to your seed. This will not harm the birds but should keep other pests at bay.

When adding high fragrance plants into the garden, be sure to place them near patios, walkways and windows in order to enjoy them fully. For cutting, be sure to pick flowers early in the morning when they are the freshest.
